- Students were tutored by teachers, community volunteers and by other students
- There were speakers presenting throughout the program. Examples include: Fireman, Hair Stylist, District Attorney, Professional Football Player, Real Estate Agent, FBI Agent & small business owners
- Students had the opportunity to seek advice from program volunteers, technology director/program director as well as one on one with speakers
- Students had access to computers, printers and copy machines to help with homework and school projects
- Many students used time for homework and tutoring and they also played games, socialized and had a chance to meet new friends
- During the first year, the average attendance was been between 75-100 students & high was 114 students. 40-60 students attended on a regular basis and 125 students attended more than 4 times
- Wide variety of students attended from freshmen to seniors & academic excellence to those who struggled with grades
- Students represented band, football, softball, basketball, wrestlers, track and field and others who were not involved in extracurricular activities
- Students came from different economic backgrounds, different races and ethnic backgrounds
